Take this opportunity to experiment and create an original art piece using Tsukineko All-Purpose Ink. Fabric ink resembles working in water colour. Learn several techniques to bring your ideas to life on fabric.

- brush & aloe vera
- highlighting
- Fantastic applicators
- shading
- learn to paint details
- add dimension
- drawings provided

Leave with a booklet of techniques and a painted sample piece to be machine quilted.

Supply List

You will be painting nature - flowers, birds, frogs, vegetables, bugs, fruit or fish

- pencil/pen for note taking
- one or two large white or opaque plastic trash bags
- dress to paint, perhaps an apron is in order
- ultra fine Sharpie
- pencil, preferably 3H or 4H
- blue painters tape (presenter will have some, you do not need much)
- Tsukinedo All Purpose Ink in colours of your choice (black and white inks are nice extras as they can really add to your colour palette)
- Fantastic applicators in both pointed and bullet tip
- fabric paint brush (all you need is one or two) available at Michaels, (presenter will bring some)
- a small piece of white cotton cloth to use as a rub cloth (1/8 of a meter)
- a small craft iron and a small padded ironing surface for your workspace (if you have them) especially if getting up to walk to an ironing board is an issue
- about 1 meter of cloth for practicing on
- about 1 meter of PFD fabric in a tight weave for a more practiced, "good" piece
- small paint cups with hinged lids to mix and store ink in (buy at Dollar Store)
- fabric markers if you already have them (Fabrico Dual-Tip Fabric Markers preferred)
